Examples include leisure classes, playgrounds, after school recreation programs, basketball leagues, and arts and crafts activities.

Step 3 of 8 - Economic Vitality

Business Retention: Help all existing businesses to be successful and provide the services necessary for the community.

Examples include Brand Blvd. of Cars, Façade Improvement Programs, Merchants Associations and Business Improvement Districts.

Economic Growth: Attract new businesses to Glendale to continue to provide for the needs of the community.

Examples include the Americana, Galleria improvements.

Jobs and Job Training: Provide job-seekers with skill development programs and helps employers find employees with desired skill sets and work experience.

Examples include computer training, youth employment, nurses training, and retraining of displaced workers, resume preparation, mock interviews and other services provided by the Verdugo Jobs Center.

City Funds/Emergency Funds: Maintain satisfactory levels of reserve funding. Funds are placed in interest earning savings accounts to be used for unplanned needs or emergencies.

An example would be "rainy day funds" to deal with unexpected emergencies.

Housing Downtown: Develop urban style housing in downtown Glendale.

Examples include Monterey Towers, Paseo Colorado, and other mixed use projects (housing above retail).

Transit-Oriented Development: Promote development of high density projects around major

roadways and mass transit routes to help reduce automobile traffic.

Examples include transit going in and out of Galleria and Holly St. in Pasadena (which is over a train station).

Variety of Housing: Provide diverse housing opportunities in the City.

Examples include single family and multi-family housing, studios, live/work, row house style, townhouses, condos, and apartments.

Examples: Senior housing, Section 8, First Time Homebuyer's Program, Orange St., Habitat for Humanity, and Vine-Pacific.

Public Transportation: Provide convenient, cost effective, safe, multi-destination transportation options.

Examples include Beeline Bus and dial-a-ride.

Traffic: Manage and improve the design of traffic flow, minimize congestion, and improve safety via signals, roadways and signs.

Examples include crosswalk "sting" operations, cameras at prominent intersections to avoid gridlock and accidents, and in-roadway warning lights ("disco lights").

Parking: Provide convenient, safe and accessible parking.

Examples include Orange St. garage, exchange & Marketplace, and requiring suitable parking requirements for new development.

Long-Term Regional Transportation Plan:

Collaborate with surrounding communities to develop long-term transportation plans to improve regional traffic flow.

Examples include Metrolink, Burbank, and Pasadena connections

Examples include LA River bikeway, the Chandler Avenue bikeway (Burbank), and freeway pedestrian bridges.

Parks and Recreation Facilities: Provide parks and recreation facilities throughout the city.
Examples include Maple Park, Wilson Mini Park, Scholl Canyon Golf Course.

An example would be Deukmejian Wilderness Park.

Community Centers: Provide funding for building, maintaining and programming City community centers.
Examples include Pacific/Edison, Maple Park, Adult Recreation Center, and Verdugo Job Center.

Technologies for Public Access: Provide convenient and accessible technologies for public access,
Examples include high speed web access, Building Permit kiosks at home improvement stores (for builders or contractors), city business on-line services, video streaming of public meetings, and on-line access for paying fees and bills.

Libraries: Build and maintain high quality libraries that are conveniently located with state of the art technology and quality resources.
Examples: The Brand Library and Art Center, Pacific/Edison, Central Library.

Streets: Construct, maintain and repair the city's roadways.
Examples include City efforts to provide roadways that are clearly marked, free of potholes, well-lit and posted with understandable directional signs and signals.

Police: Provide Police Services that include crime prevention, investigation and quick response.
Examples: Officers patrolling the streets, in-school resource officers, detectives to investigate crimes, specialized gang enforcement officers and Community Policing (COPPS) activities.

Fire: Provide a Fire Department that maintains a Class I Rating (highest in the country). Fire services include fire prevention, rapid extinguishing of fires, paramedic services and disaster response.
Examples include providing quick response time to emergencies, hazard inspection of nightclubs and assembly halls, Emergency Medical Technician/Paramedics, and partnerships with surrounding communities (Verdugo Communication Center).

Building Safety: Ensure that housing, buildings and infrastructure are safely constructed.
Examples include plan checks for safe construction standards and inspections during residential and commercial building construction.

Code Compliance: Ensure that neighborhoods and business districts are safe, well-maintained and free of blight.
Examples include graffiti removal, demolition of unsafe structures, removal of junk and furniture from City parkways, and inspections of housing units and businesses to ensure they meet health and safety standards.

Disaster Preparedness: Provide programs and services to respond to in natural disasters or terrorist acts.
Examples include the Police Mobile Command Center, City staff trained as first responders to mudslides, earthquakes, wildfires and train wrecks, Neighborhood Watch programs, GTV6 (City television) emergency broadcasting, and training programs to train the community (GRIP, CERT).

Health and Wellness: Provide programs and services to residents to prevent illness/injury and encourage healthy living.

Examples include flu shot clinics, CPR classes, public education classes (e.g., literacy programs for seniors on how to read medicine labels), health fairs, partnerships with health care facilities (3 major hospitals), fitness programs, Fire and Police intervention programs for health/drug problems, and community health facilities

Public Art: Promote the installation of public art pieces and encourages good architectural design. Examples: public art and design review requirement include in the development/permit process, Glendale City Center Fountain and Statue, Benjamin Franklin statue at the Exchange, and the Marketplace Frog Fountain.

Neighborhood Character/Community Planning: Work diligently to ensure that new development reflects the vision of the community and respects the character and defining elements of individual neighborhoods.

Examples include Verdugo Woodlands, Adams Hill, and the Montrose Shopping Park.

Historic Preservation: Administer programs and policies to preserve historic neighborhoods and business districts.

Examples include the Ivy Glen Housing Project (Goode House), Brand Library, and Adams Square.


